General Guidelines

1: Each Degree must be completed in order: Bachelor, Masters, and then Doctorate. You don't have to finish this by the time we move on to the next degree. Just keep going where you are, or jump to the next degree. You can work and accomplish the tasks for the next degree, you just can't complete the degree without the first degree being done first. (Did that make any sense?)

2: This Co-op will run from September to June with Graduation in June. Basic schedule is:

Bachelor Degree: September to December

Master Degree: January to March

Doctorate Degree: April to June

3: If you find an item you do consistently and well, challenge yourself to do something different. Don't make baking powder biscuits for a requirement if you make them every Sunday. Try a variation on that item, or choose something else entirely.

4: If you need help in completing a requirement, please send in a request for help on the group site. That's why we are working together so that when we reach things that we are unsure of, we can borrow the expertise of others to learn!

5: You can have the requirements signed off by uploading pictures into your personal album on the yahoo group site (be sure to set this up! as a personal album, not a public album. Other individuals will still be able to see it, just not add to it!) If this is not an option, because you do not have a digital camera, a camera phone, etc. then be sure to write in a summary of what you did and how it turned out!

6: You must make an apron (this is a bachelor degree item!) of your choice to be worn on graduation day as part of your gown. You will need to have someone take a picture of you in your gown (just a nice church dress/attire) and added to our Graduation Gallery come June.
