#### Honesty in a nutshell!

In order to do this you will need quotes, clip art, even some music.

#### Quotes:

You must give the proper authoring to the person who originally stated it. What does that mean? That means that if Harriet Tubman said it-you give her "props" by saying something like: "by Harriet Tubman" or "~Harriet Tubman" Anything that will indicate that the original was said by Harriet Tubman.

Your quotes need to focus on honesty. The aspect of honesty you want to focus on is your choice. Such as do you want to focus on Why to be honest or consequences of NOT being honest. Either is fine.

#### Clipart:

You'll need to come up with some clipart or graphics that will be a backdrop to your quotes. Now keep in mind that there are copyrights. So you can only use either your own drawings or what is called royalty free clipart (all those found in your word processing programs are royalty free).
